

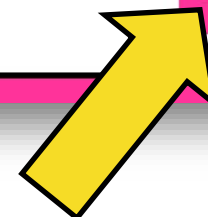

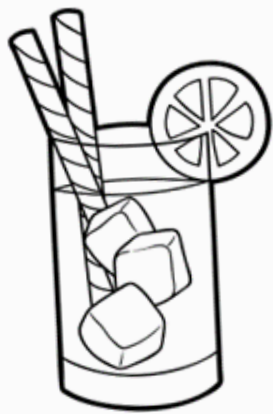

# NO PREP NEEDED!

## HOW TO PLAY THIS GAME:



1. No prep needed! You can play this game "straight out of the box"!
2. Divide students into 4-5 teams. I usually have the teams move desks so they can confer on answers.
3. Keep score on a whiteboard (teacher or student volunteer), or ask one person on each team to keep track of the scores as they play.
4. Team 1 picks a category and dollar amount. Click the question. If the team answers correctly, they "win" that dollar amount.
5. If Team 1 answers incorrectly, they lose the dollar amount.
6. Click "Back to Game Board" to return to the game board.
