

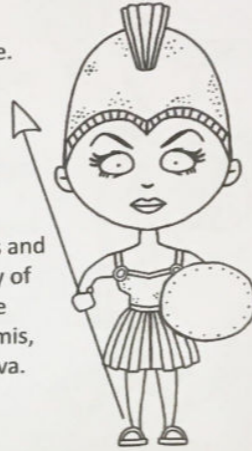

The Wise One: Athena

Remember Zeus's first wife Metis? Zeus feared her and ultimately turned her into a fly and ate her. But Metis was already pregnant with a child—Athena—when Zeus ate her.

There came a day where Zeus had a tremendous headache. He sat down and clawed at his head, and POOF! Out popped a fully-grown goddess, dressed in a suit of shiny armor. This was Athena, the Goddess of Wisdom, Warfare, and Handicrafts. Her symbol is an olive tree, and her animal is a wise owl.

Athena, also called Pallas Athena, appears in many stories and is so revered by the Greeks that they named the great city of Athens in her honor. Athena's ongoing feud with her uncle Poseidon sets the stage for many Greek stories. Like Artemis, Athena vowed never to marry. Her Roman name is Minerva.



ATHENA AND ARACHNE

There was once a shepherd's daughter who excelled at weaving from a young age. Word about her talent spread, and people from miles around would travel just to have Arachne weave cloth for them.

It wasn't long before Arachne's fame went to her head. Arachne became arrogant and started boasting about how she was a better weaver than Athena herself! Athena heard of Arachne's boasting, and enraged, challenged Arachne to a contest to decide, once and for all, who was the better weaver.

The contest began. Athena wove a colorful tapestry of the conquests and battles of the gods. Her tapestry showed the gods' mighty power over man displayed throughout every scene. Arachne also wove a tapestry of the gods, but her tapestry depicted the gods' cruel treatment and abuse of men and women.

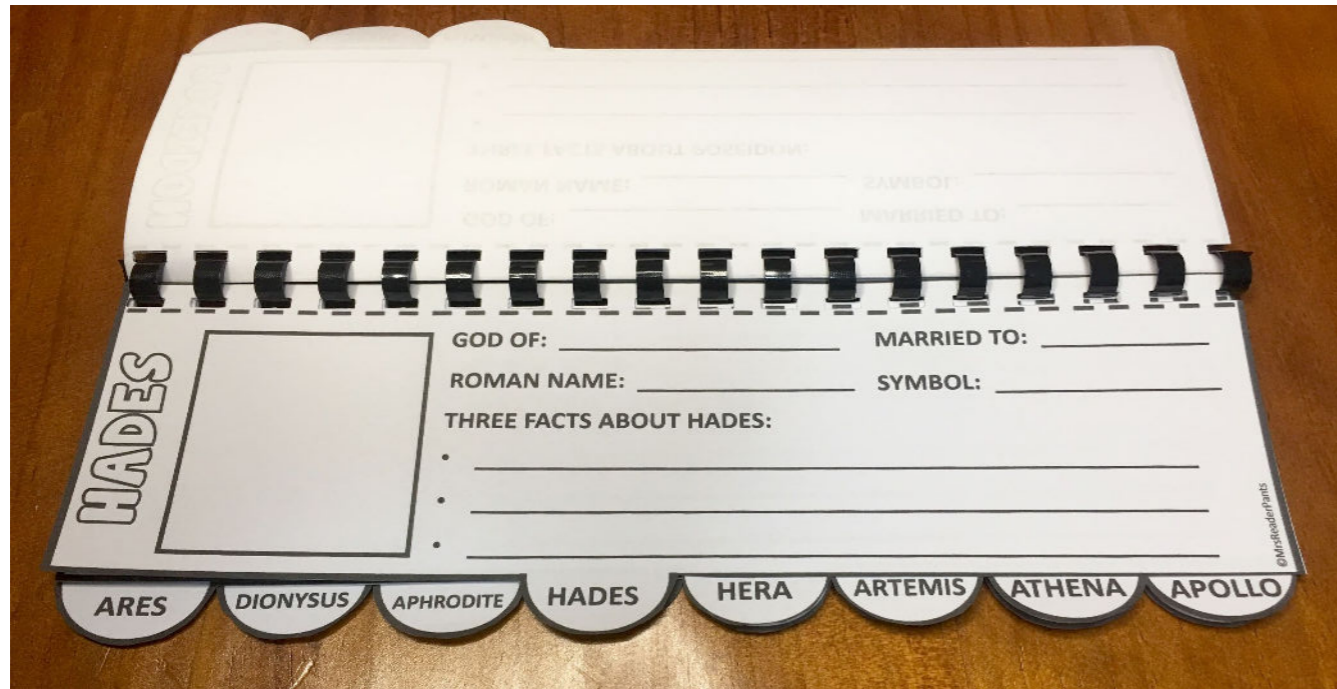
In some stories, Arachne won, further provoking Athena's wrath. In other stories, Athena won, and she wanted to punish Arachne for her hubris, or extreme pride.

Either way, Arachne's ending didn't turn out well for her. Whether as punishment or out of anger over being defeated, Athena turned Arachne into the world's first spider. Arachne and all her descendants would live out their days weaving beautiful webs but never able to say a word.

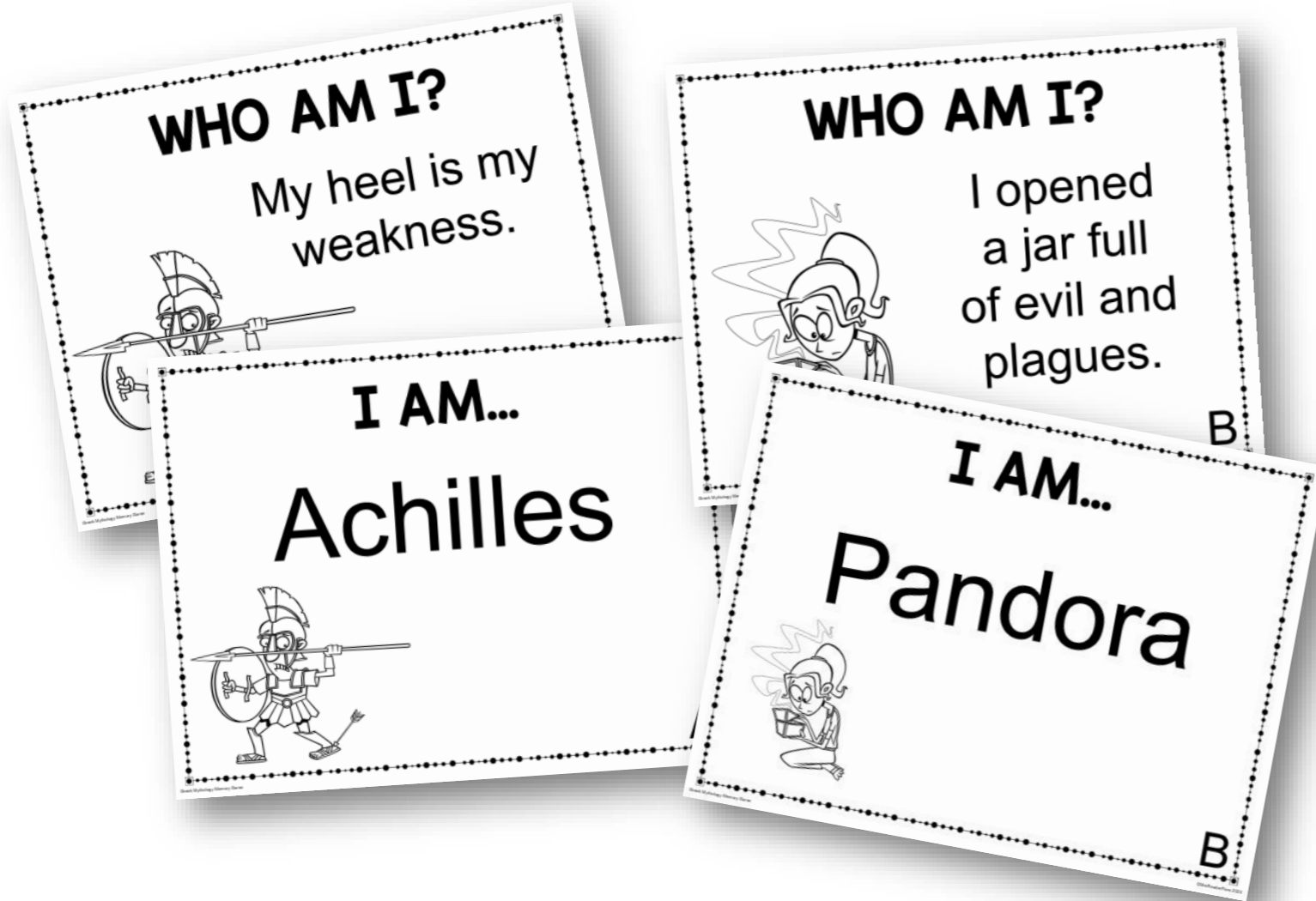
