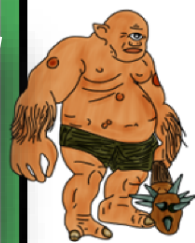

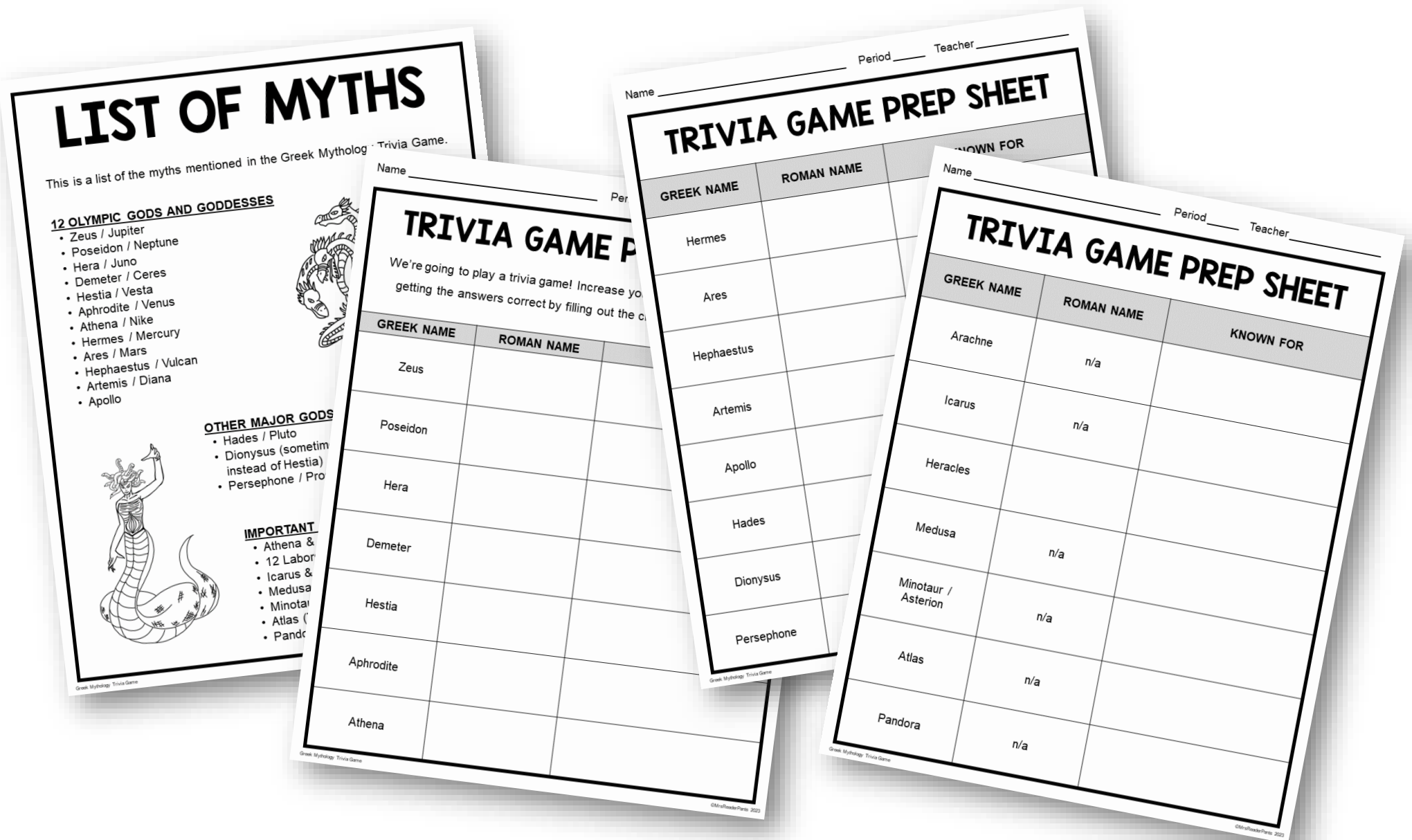

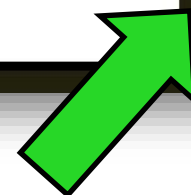
A. The wings got too hot.

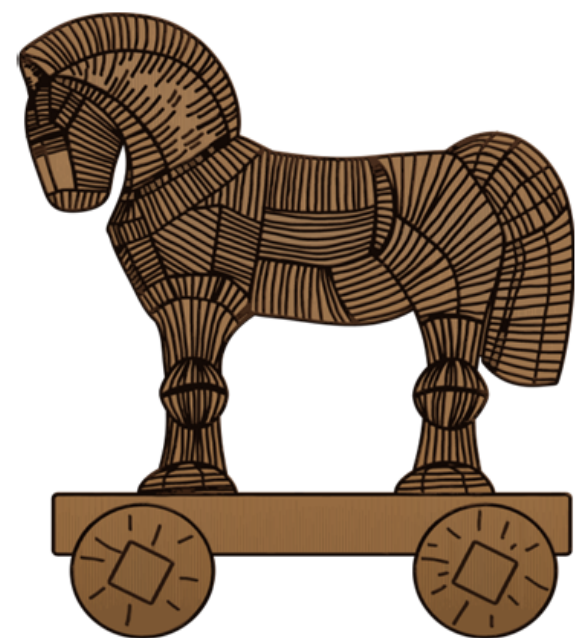

Ares doesn't appear prominently in many myths. Even though he was the God of War, his side (the Trojans) lost the long and bloody Trojan War. The Greeks won the war after they gave the Trojans a wooden horse as a gift.

It was a trick - Greek soldiers were hiding inside the horse.

NO PREP NEEDED!

HOW TO PLAY THIS GAME:

1. No prep needed! You can play this game "straight out of the box"!
2. Divide students into 4-5 teams. I usually have the teams move desks so they can confer on answers.
3. Keep score on a whiteboard (teacher or student volunteer), or ask one person on each team to keep track of the scores.
4. Team 1 picks a category and dollar amount. Click the question. If the team answers correctly, they "win" that dollar amount.
5. If Team 1 answers incorrectly, Team 2 will get a chance to "steal" the question. If Team 2 answers the question correctly, Team 2 wins that dollar amount and gets to choose another question.
6. If Team 2 answers incorrectly, the question is thrown out. Team 2 gets to choose a new question.
