# HERE'S WHAT YOU'LL GET

## HOW TO PLAY THIS GAME:

1. No prep needed! You can play this game "straight out of the box"!
2. Divide students into 4-5 teams. I usually have the teams move desks so they can confer on answers.
3. Keep score on a whiteboard (teacher or student volunteer), or ask one person on each team to keep track of the scores.
4. Team 1 picks a category and dollar amount. Click the question. If the team answers correctly, they "win" that dollar amount.
5. If Team 1 answers incorrectly, Team 2 will get a chance to "steal" the question. If Team 2 answers the question correctly, Team 2 wins that dollar amount and gets to choose another question.
6. If Team 2 answers incorrectly, the question is thrown out. Team 2 gets to choose a new question.
7. Continue to play until all the questions have been selected or class time is over. The team with the most money scored wins!
8. Possible prizes: candy/treats (they are happy with even one Starburst or a roll of Smarties), homework passes, pencils, gift cards to school snack shop, outside time, etc.

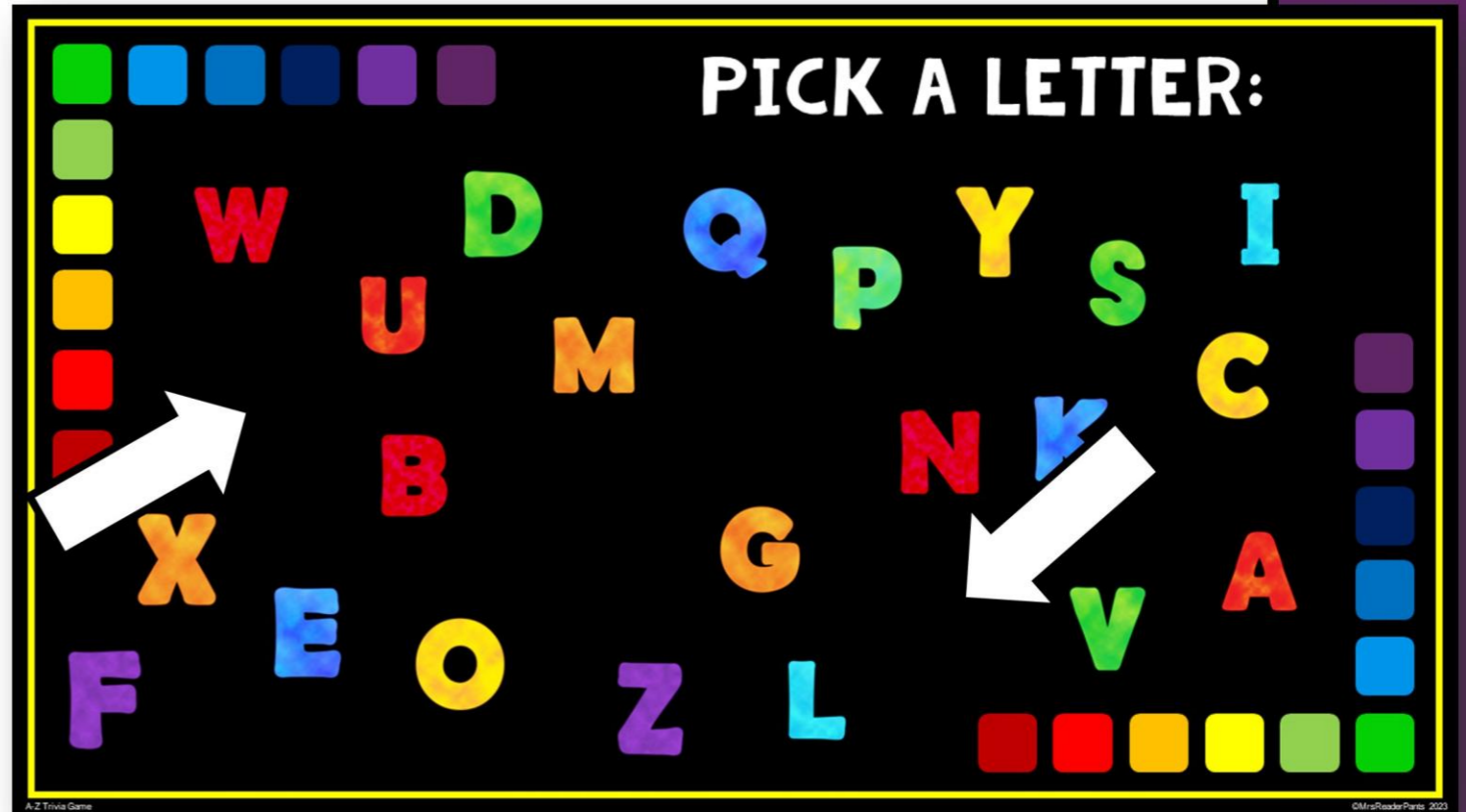

When playing the game in full-screen mode, the letters on the board disappear after they are clicked! Be sure to use the navigation buttons in the game, not the ENTER or arrow keys.


This helps ensure smooth game play.

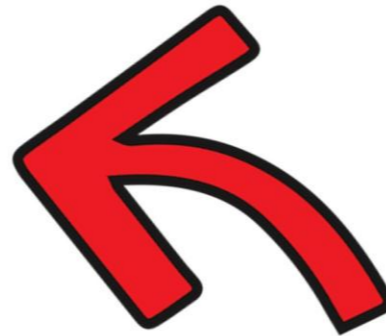
