SPOTTING FAKE NEWS

Things to ask yourself:

- Who is telling this story?
- Why are they telling it?
- Are there spelling errors?
- Are there exclamation marks?
- Are there lots of advertisements?
- Does the information make sense?
- Can I find this story somewhere else?
- Who are they quoting?
- What might be left out?

(noun)


Clickbait is a sensational headline, photo, or ad that is designed to get people to click it.






