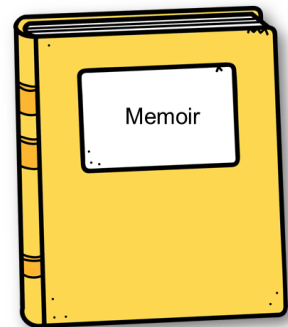
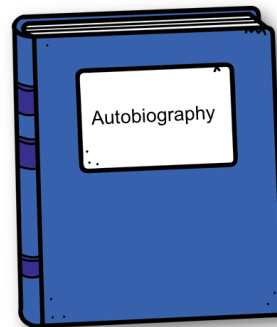
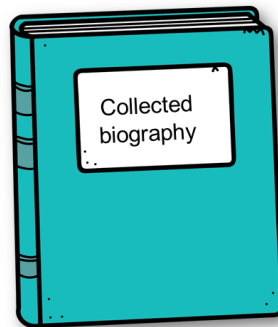


BIOGRAPHY

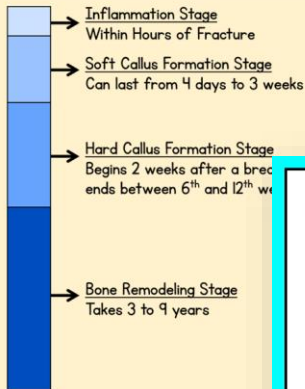

TEXT FEATURES: TIMELINE

- Visual representation of events over a period of time
- Data is chronological (in order of occurrence)
- May be used for historical events, project timelines

FEMTON METER HISTORIA

Love timelines? You should visit Örebro, Sweden!

This is a bronze timeline walkway.

This public art installation is a long bronze strip that features major events in history.

The events begin in 1810 and go through 2010.

The name Femton Meter Historia means "Fifteen meters of history."

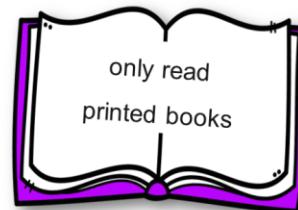

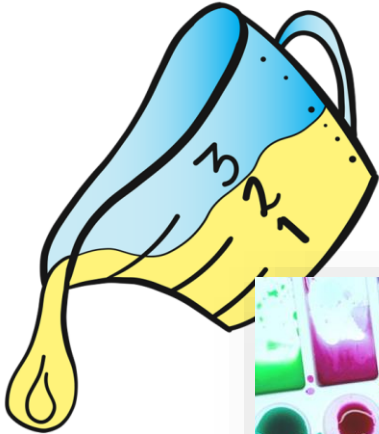

PRIMARY SOURCE



- Sources that are “straight from the horse’s mouth”
- Primary sources are original, firsthand accounts of events
- Diaries and letters
- Historical documents
- Speeches

PRIMARY SOURCE

Artwork can be a primary source!

This wall mural is in the Roman city of Pompeii, which was buried by a volcano in 79 AD. Everyone and everything in the city was buried under ash and rock for more than 1500 years.

This mural is a primary source because it helps us see how the Pompeii people lived.

- Full of random facts
- Typically easy to read with lots of illustrations
- World records
- Animal facts
- Science facts
- Outer space
- History
- Sports
- Almanacs

TYPES OF NONFICTION

ESSAY COLLECTIONS



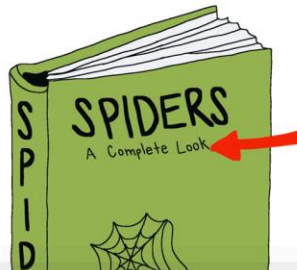
- Diverse themes – can be about many different topics
- Can be written by one author or many different authors
- Purposes can be to inform, persuade, entertain, or analyze a topic
- Short, informational writing
- If you like short stories, you might also like reading essays

TEXT FEATURES

- Index
- Boldface type
- Subtitle
- Timeline
- Also mentions: glossary, caption

TEXT FEATURE: SUBTITLE

- Shorter text that adds more information about the title
- This subtitle tells you that this book about spiders has lots of information about many different aspects of spiders.
- When writing it out, the subtitle should follow a caption like this:
 - *Spiders: A Complete Look*

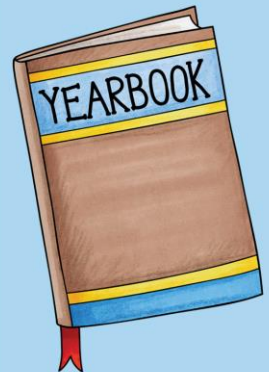

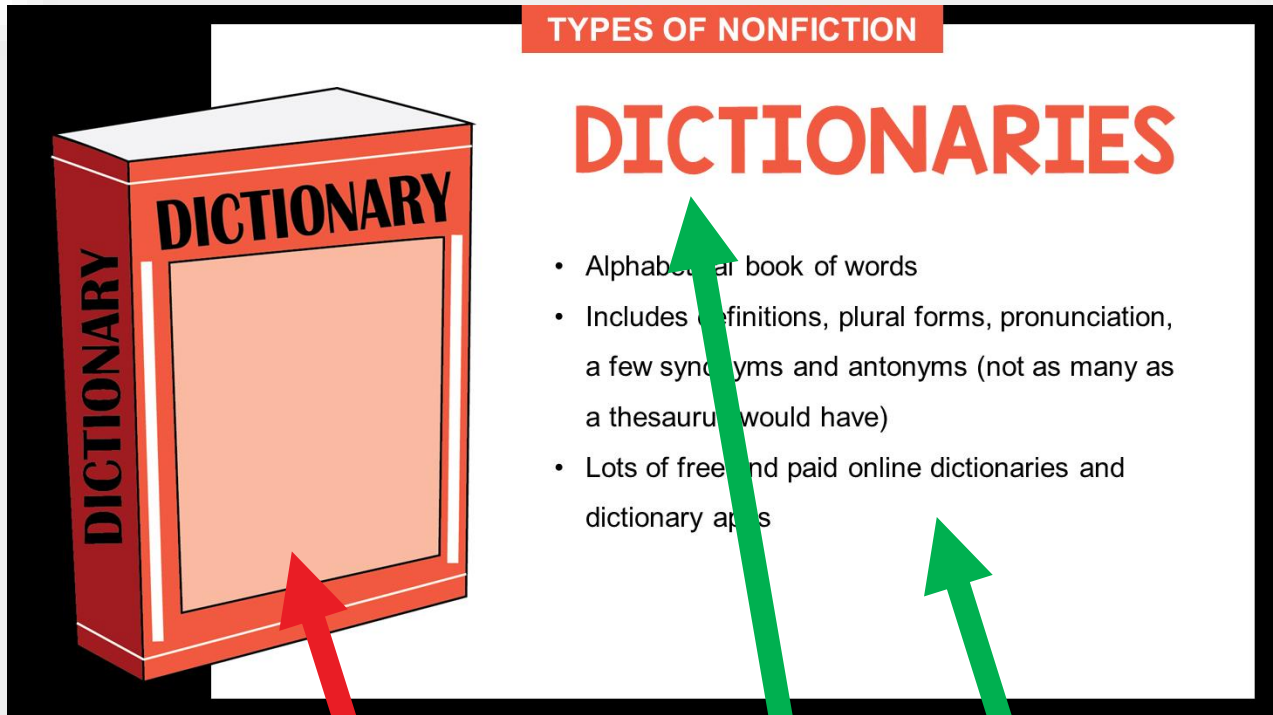



- 53% of students got their books from the school library.
- 50% got them from the public library.
- 35% of students read books that were already in their homes.
- 22% of students bought books at a retail store.
- 2% purchased books online.






