



Students sing a simple storytime song. They learn to sign "spider" in ASL sign language. Then, they play a game to determine if the statements about spiders are fact or fiction. Student instructions for each ASL sign included in the slides.

### FACT OR FICTION? STORYTIME GAME



In group discussion, students decide if these five spider statements are fact or fiction.

The venom helps the spider kill and digest their prey.





If you see a black widow spider, leave it alone!


