




SIBERT AWARD

> Robert F. Sibert established the Association for Library Service to Children (ALSC). He was also the president of a book publishing company for many years.


Whole-class discussion slides include a Shelf Marker song, sign language, a discussion about what book awards are, and five popular children's book awards.






