BRAZILIAN DISH: FEIJOADA

Many consider feijoada to be the national dish of Brazil. It is pronounced *fay-jwah-dah*.

Feijoada is a hearty stew made with black beans and a variety of pork or beef cuts, often including sausage, bacon, and ribs.

It is usually served with rice, collard greens, orange slices, and farofa (toasted cassava flour).

CHRIST THE REDEEMER

In Portuguese, this famous statue is called *Cristo Redentor*.

It was completed in 1931 and stands 98 feet (30 m) tall, not including its 26-foot (8m) pedestal.



CLIMATE

- Brazil is a huge country, so climate varies considerably in different regions
- Mostly tropical; ranges from very hot in north near the equator to mild in south
- Droughts and flooding can be problems
- Snowfall is not common but does happen in higher elevations and in the south
- Summer months are December-April since Brazil is in the southern hemisphere.


VENEZUELA COUNTRY STUDY



ORINOCO RIVER DELTA


- A **river delta** is a wetland area that forms where a river meets another body of water, such as a lake, another river, or the ocean.
- River deltas are rich in animal and plant biodiversity.
- The Orinoco River is a major river in South America.
- In Venezuela, the Orinoco empties into the Caribbean Sea. The area where the two bodies of water meet is the Orinoco River Delta.
- The Orinoco River Delta contains brackish water, which is a mix of saltwater and freshwater.

Capybaras are among the many animals living in the Orinoco River Delta.





MACHU PICCHU

Machu Picchu was built around 1450 AD.

Built high in the Andes Mountains, Machu Picchu was unknown to the outside world until American explorer Hiram Bingham "discovered" it in 1911.

You can only reach Machu Picchu by hiking up the Incan Trail or by train.

Machu Picchu is an incredible structure. It shows just how advanced the Incas were in engineering, math, and architecture.
