

BRAZILIAN DISH: FEIJOADA

Many consider feijoada to be the national dish of Brazil. It is pronounced fay-jwah-dah.

Feijoada is a hearty stew made with black beans and a variety of pork or beef cuts, often including sausage, bacon, and ribs.

It is usually served with rice, collard greens, orange slices, and farofa (toasted cassava flour)

It was completed in 1931 and stands 98 feet (30 m) tall, not including its 26-foot (8m) pedestal.




- Brazil is a huge country, so climate varies considerably in different regions

- Droughts and flooding can be problems
- Snowfall is not common but does happen in higher elevations and in the south
- Summer months are December-April since Brazil is in the southern hemisphere.


