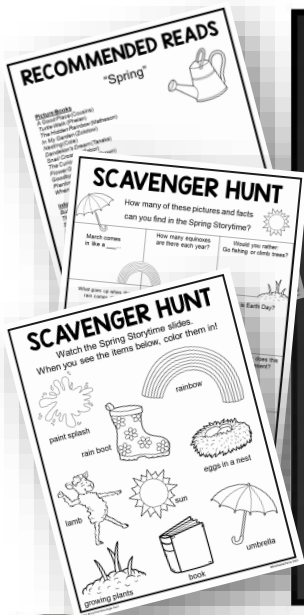

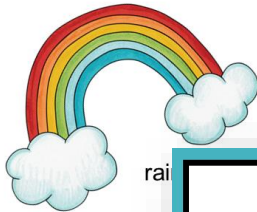

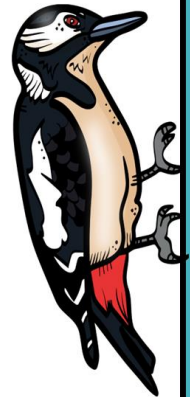

Hindus worldwide gather to celebrate the joy of spring.

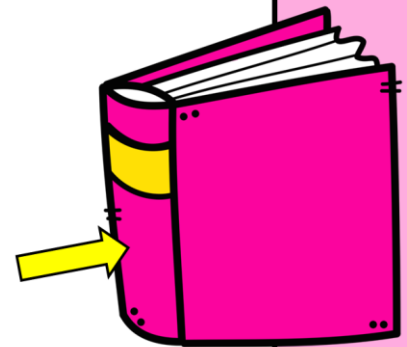
Holi is colorful! It is the celebration of the end of the dark, gray winter.

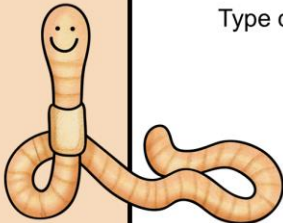

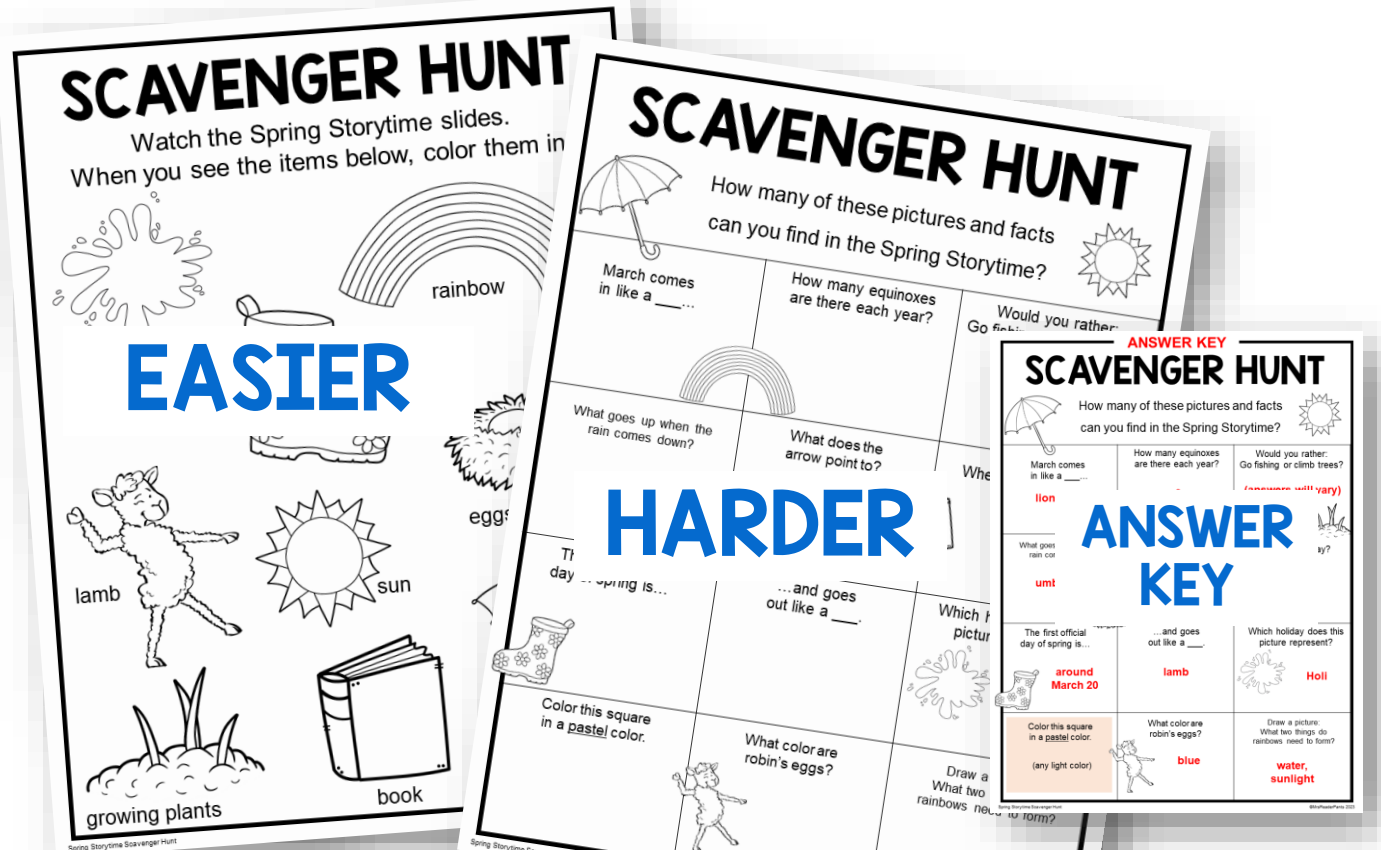

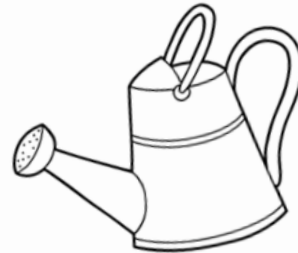
