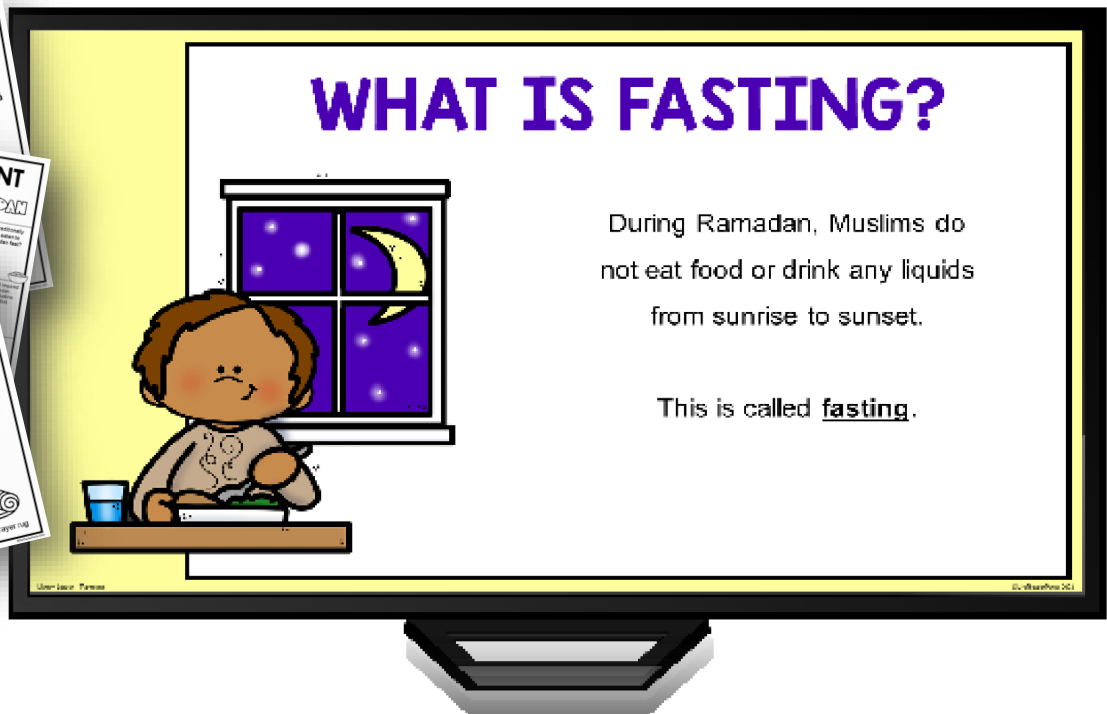

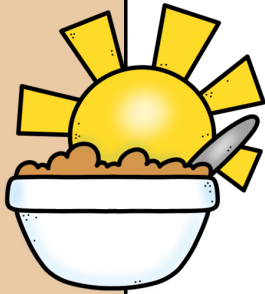

It was built in 1465 and is a major landmark in Iran.

Jabal al-Nour in Saudi Arabia.

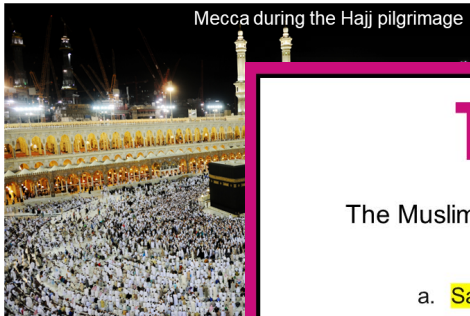
The Cave of Hira can hold only a

FASTING

(noun) The practice of intentionally not eating (and sometimes drinking) for a period of time

People **fast** for many reasons, such as health,
religion, protest, and before medical procedures.

All Muslims are required to visit the Islamic holy city of Mecca at least once in their lifetime, if they are able to do so.

This pilgrimage is called *hajj*.

Muslims visit for *hajj* on specific dates each year.
