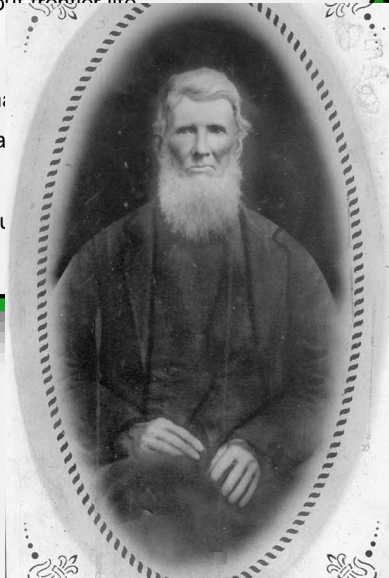
TALL TALES ARE...

- About frontier life

- Larger-than-life characters
- Wilderness and nature
- Sometimes based on real people
- Passed down through generations

PART I-LESSON

YOUNG ADULT



At age 18, John left home. He and his 11-year old stepbrother Nathaniel lived a nomadic lifestyle. This means they moved around a lot, slept outdoors, and lived off the land.

PLANTING AMERICA



John took his knowledge of apple trees and kept traveling. He walked across the American Midwest frontier, planting apple trees.

John loved nature. He slept outside often and lived off the land. John was deeply religious, and he believed that nature and God are intertwined.

This lesson presentation teaches the story of Johnny Appleseed.

The “Scrolling Slides” help extend your lesson on Johnny Appleseed. Play these during and after checkout while students work on slideshow scavenger hunt.

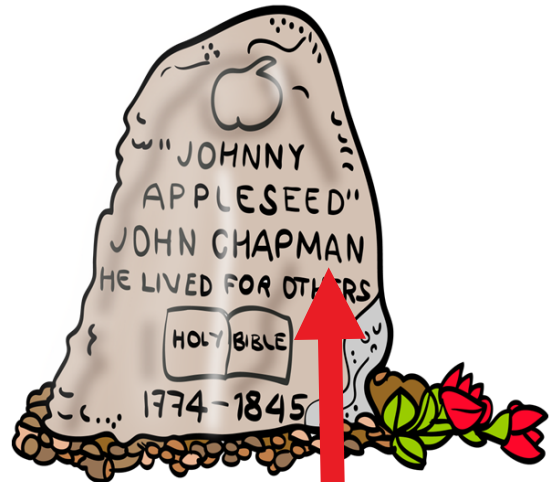
EDITABLE TEXT

WAS PAUL BUNYAN REAL?

Stories of Paul Bunyan are set in the northern parts of the USA and in Canada.

Paul is not a real person, but he may have been based on a real person named Jack Fournier, who was also very tall and strong.

Jack Fournier was also sometimes called "Saginaw Joe." He was a French-Canadian lumberjack who had huge hands. Some people said Jack was so large that he had two full sets of teeth!
