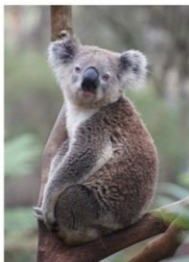

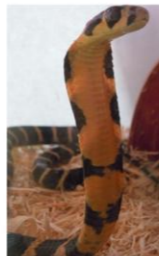

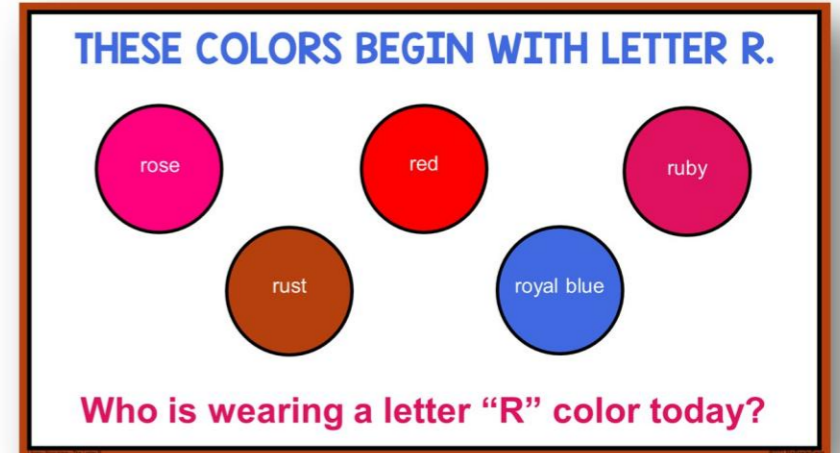


All 26 letters include a search-and-find scavenger hunt activity for after the lesson.
