


Ice shelves are huge, permanent floating sheets of ice.


Most of the world's ice shelves around the coasts of Antarctica.



PART I - WHOLE-GROUP LESSON

Part I is a whole-group lesson.

It is a librarian-led, guided discussion to introduce Antarctica.



PART II - SCROLLING SLIDES



The slides in Part II need to be set on a timer (instructions with visuals included).

The scrolling slides include fun facts about Antarctica, vocabulary, Would-You-Rathers, and Antarctica trivia questions.

Students watch the slideshow to find the images and information included in the differentiated Scavenger Hunt activities.

ON THE SPECIALS ROTATION?

Move the slides around within the presentation to increase or decrease difficulty levels for different grade levels.

This helps keeps the lesson interesting for you if you are a Specials rotation librarian teaching the same lesson multiple times during the week.



EASY-TO-READ FONTS

LAND UNDER THE ICE

Remember, a continent is a land mass.

Even though Antarctica is almost completely covered in ice, there is land under the ice.




All my resources are designed to **maximize readability** and accessibility for all students.

There is no cursive, no fancy fonts, and no random capitalizations.

Lines of text are spaced at 1.5 throughout the slide presentation.

CLEAN BACKGROUNDS AND FONT COLORS



Header text is in color for emphasis.

These design choices help ensure the text is as clean and clear as possible for students with dyslexia or vision challenges.
