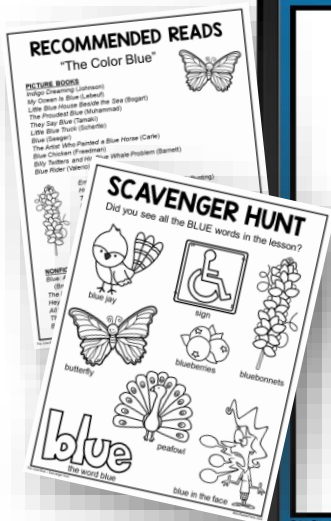

(wrist should stay straight)

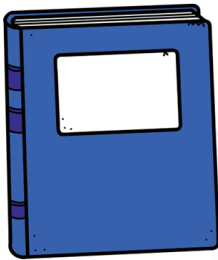

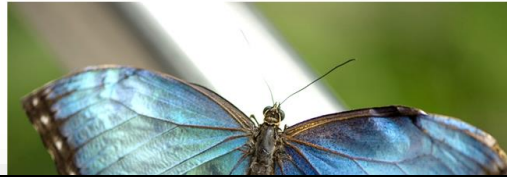
Students learn a nursery rhyme, practice counting syllables, learn two “blue” idioms, and determine which words rhyme with blue.

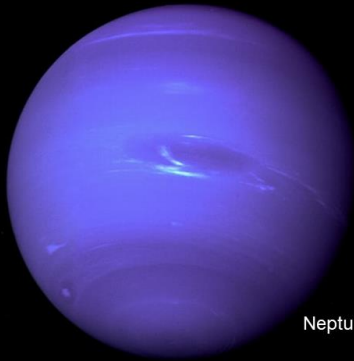

THE STUDENTS WILL...

- Listen and participate in the Storytime Discussion about the color Blue
- Say "blue" in ASL + four spoken languages
- Clap and count the syllables "blue" and "butterfly"
- Define primary colors and name the three primary colors
- Identify blue items around the library or classroom
