THE STUDENTS WILL...

- Listen and participate in the Storytime Discussion about the color Orange
- Say "orange" in ASL + four spoken languages
- Clap and count the syllables "orange" and "basketball"
- Understand that red + yellow = orange
- Identify some orange items around the school and where to find them
