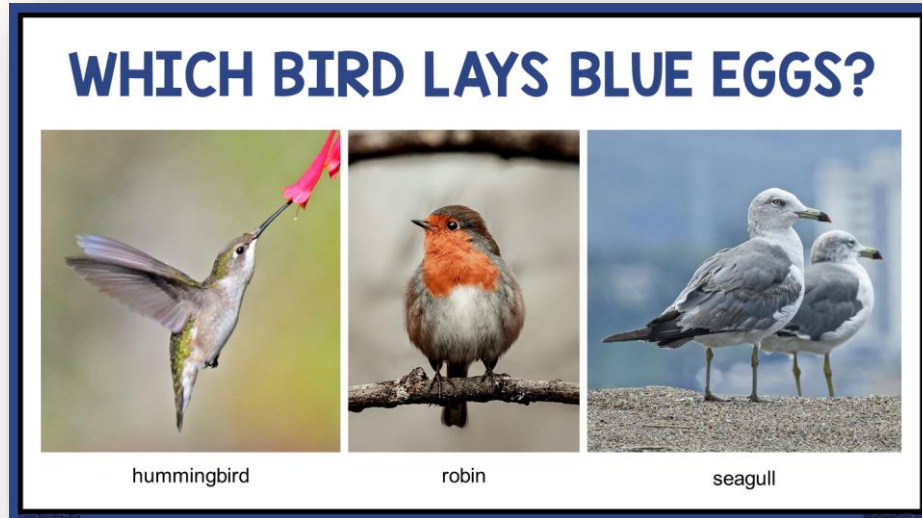

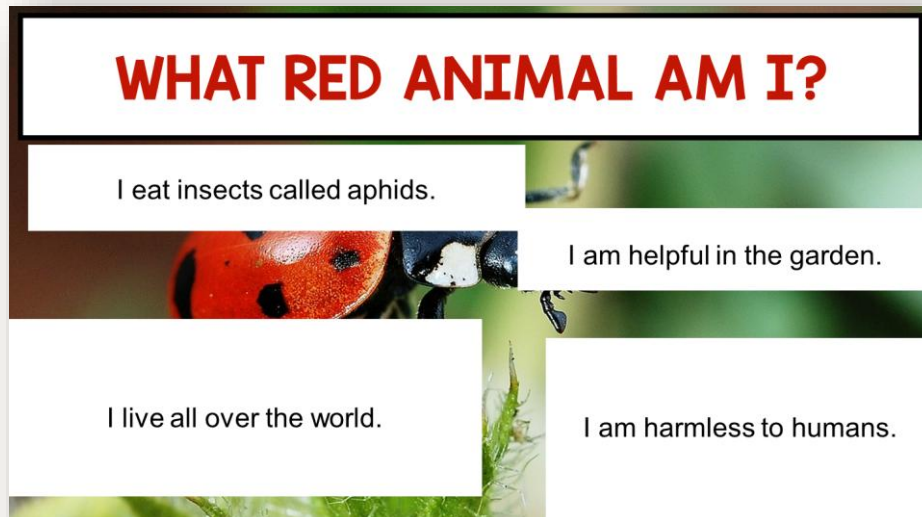

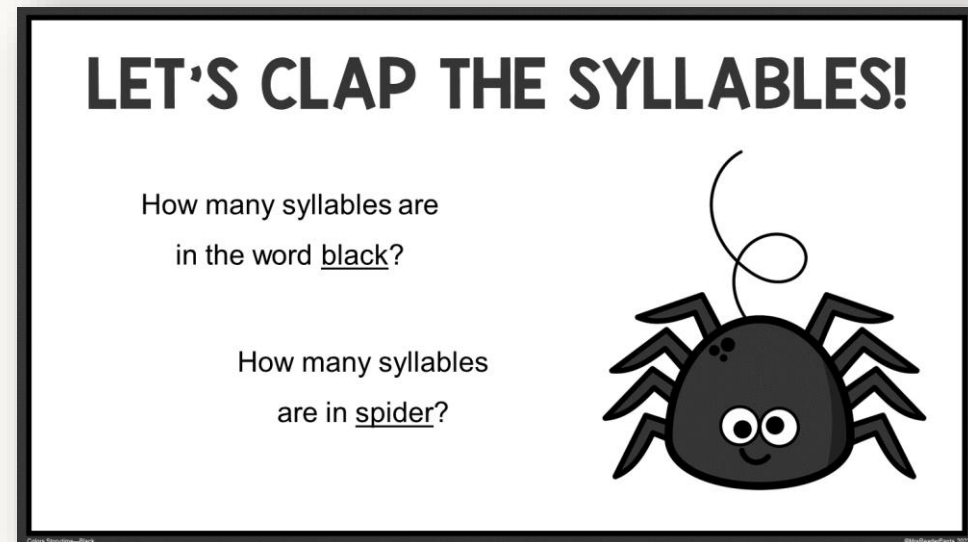


DESIGNED FOR THE SPECIALS ROTATION

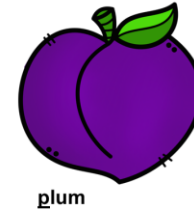

LESSON PLAN

THE STUDENTS WILL...

- Differentiate between fiction and nonfiction books (focuses on animal books)
- Listen and participate in the Storytime Discussion about the color brown
- Say "brown" in ASL + four spoken languages
- Clap and count the syllables "brown" and "teddy bear"
- Understand that blue + yellow + red = brown

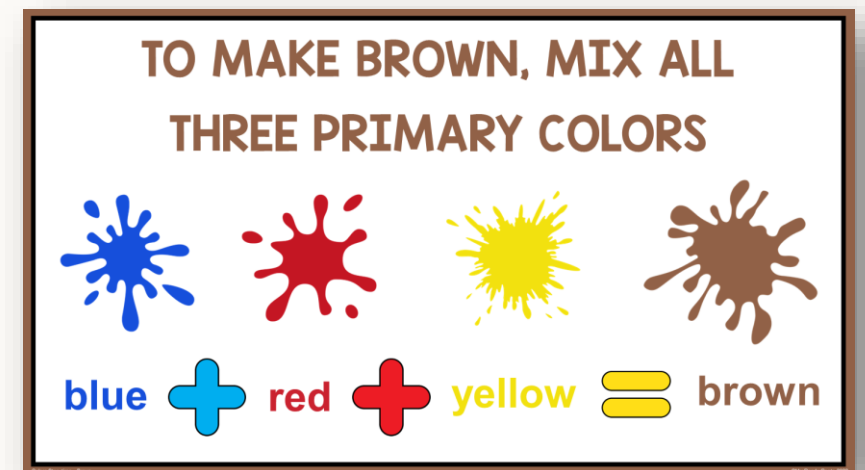
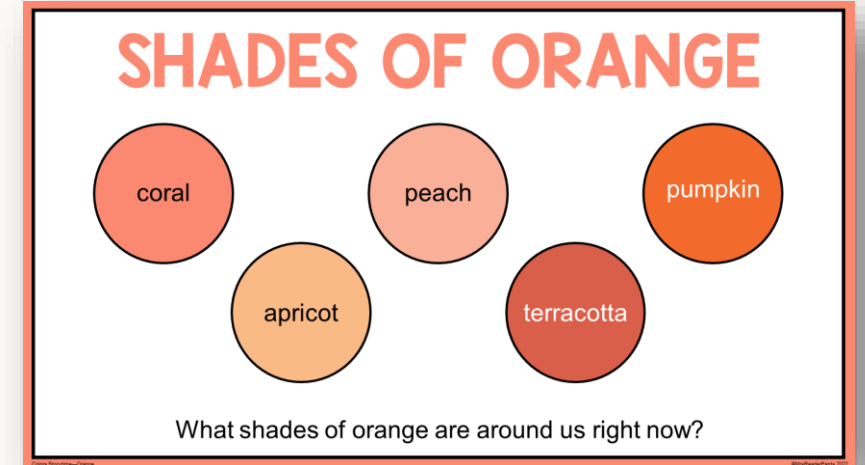
