

Río Grande de Tárcoles is a large river in Costa Rica. It is well-known for having lots of crocodiles!

- · 83% white or mestizo (European and indigenous)
- · 6.7% mulatto (black and white)
- 2% indigenous
- · Community and family are important
- Official language is Spanish, but many people also speak English
- Lots of seasonal migrant laborers from Nicaragua (often entering illegally, which causes tensions)
- A person from Costa Rica is called a <u>Costa</u> <u>Rican</u>.



- Relax in the hot springs


