



WHY BUY THE BUNDLE?

WHAT MAKES A DESERT?

Salar de Uyuni in Bolivia is the world's largest salt flat. It is a salt desert.




- · Terrestrial (land) biome
- Very dry climate with almost no rainfall
- · High levels of evaporation
- Sparse vegetation
- Extreme temperatures
- Rocky, sandy, salty, or snowy terrain

<u>Fun fact</u>: Deserts cover about 1/5 of the land area on earth.

Both have extremely cold temperatures.


