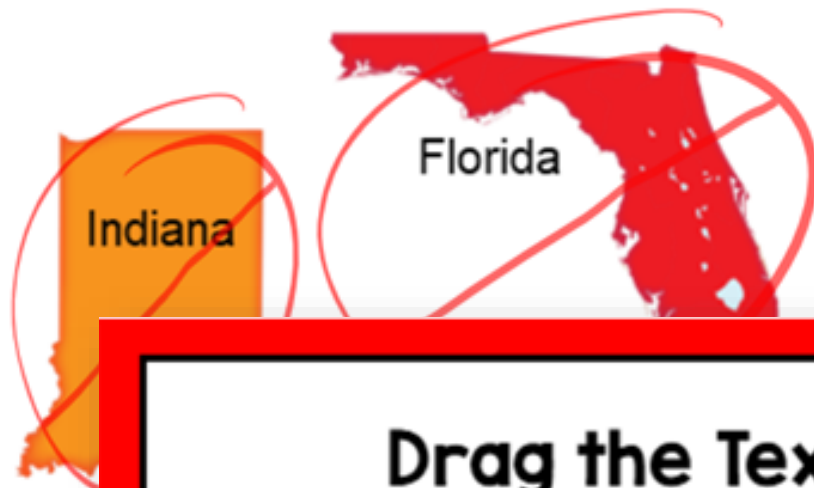

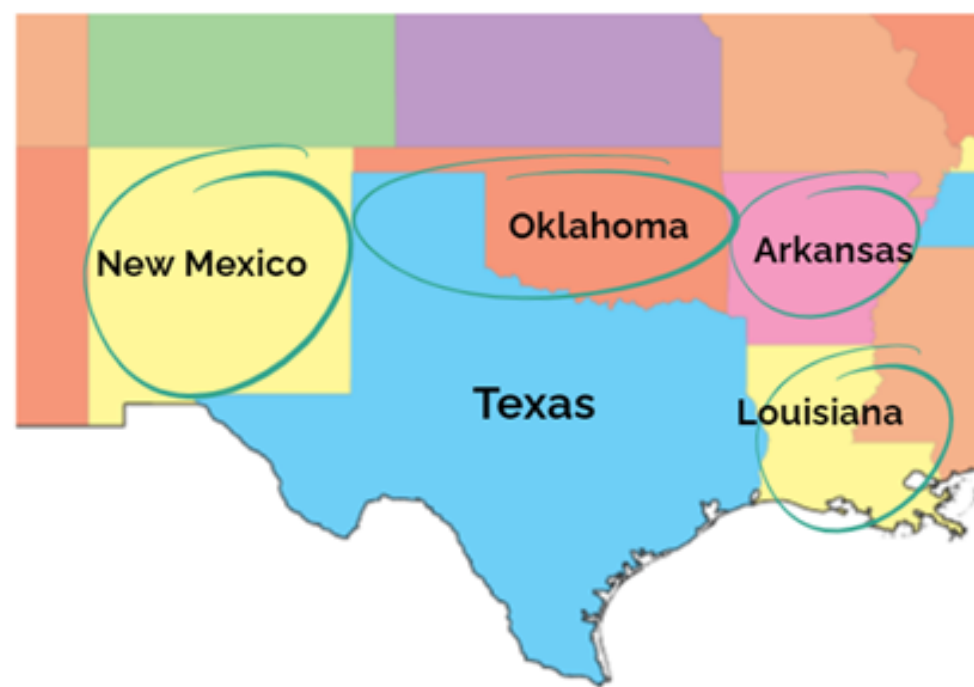

1900 Galveston Hurricane

Well over 100 years later, the Galveston Hurricane is still the most devastating hurricane in US history.

There were between 8000-12,000 deaths. The highest sustained windspeed was 145 mph, which made it a Category 4 hurricane.

The 1900 Storm Memorial statue was dedicated in 2000, on the 100th anniversary of this event.

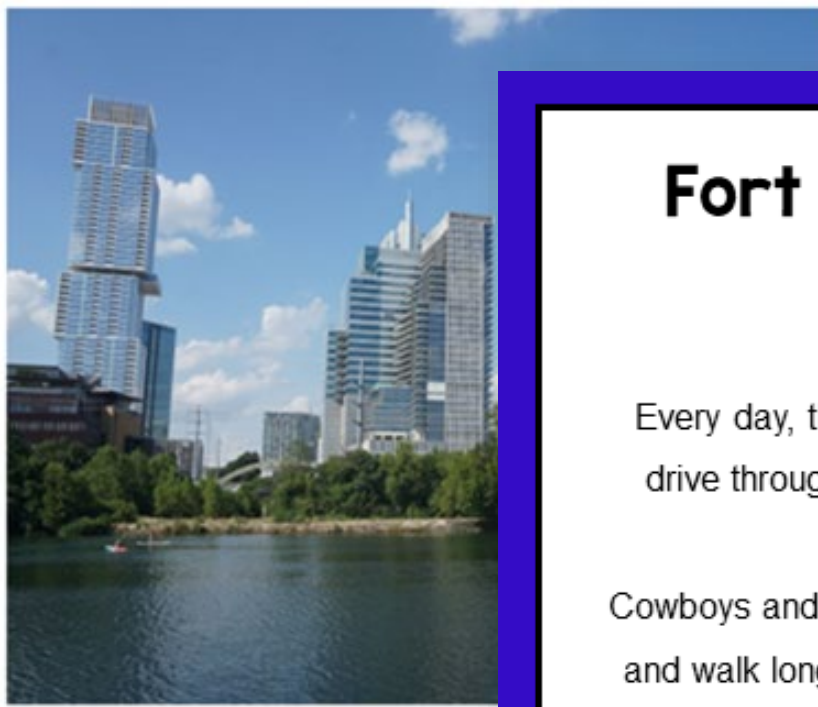

How do I grade the cards?
