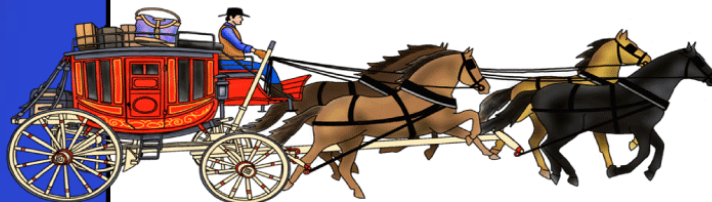

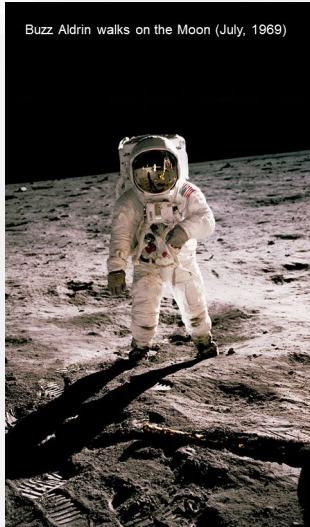

HISTORICAL FICTION CHARACTERISTICS

- Fiction, but set in an historical time period
- Setting (time and place) is very important to the story
- Characters may have really existed, fictional characters, or a mix of both

HISTORICAL NONFICTION

- Learning through information
- Factual
- May be entertaining, but main purpose is to inform
- Includes facts and dates
- Includes only real people
- Includes maps, photos, documents
- Includes source notes, references, and/or bibliography



HISTORICAL FICTION

- Learning through imagination
- Creative
- May be informative, but main purpose is to entertain
- Includes characters and dialogue
- May or may not include real people
- May include maps, photos, documents
- May include source notes, references, or bibliography, but does not have to

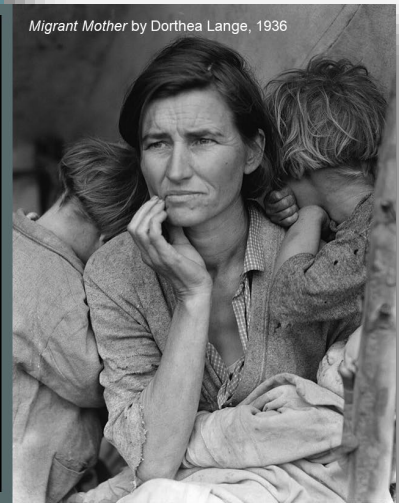
WHY SHOULD WE READ HISTORICAL FICTION?

WHY SHOULD WE READ HISTORICAL FICTION?

- Helps develop empathy for people who experienced trauma, loss, persecution in history
- Gives life to the experiences of people whose perspectives have been largely left out of history (women, children, immigrants, indigenous people, poor people, slaves, LGBT, etc.)

- Set in England or France around the years 1795-1837

CHARACTERISTICS OF STEAMPUNK

- Hybrid genre – Steampunk combines elements of several genres including: science fiction, historical fiction, fantasy, and/or horror.
- Gets its name from steam powered engines used in 19th Century

WESTERN

- Set in American Wild West, northern Mexico, or Western Canada (or similar setting)
- Mid-late 1800s
- US Civil War and Reconstruction may be part of the story
- Horses, prairie survival, pioneers, Gold Rush, one-room schoolhouses
- vigilante justice, saloons, cowboys, outlaws, sheriffs, duels, gunslingers
- Women, African Americans, and Native Americans have few, if any, rights

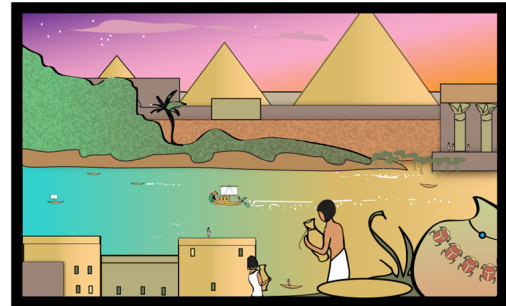

5 THINGS EVERY HISTORICAL FICTION STORY NEEDS...

Number 1: A well-researched setting

- You are creating a world that no longer exists – be descriptive!
- Before you start writing, you need to really know the time period well.
- No matter how much you know about the time period, other people will know it better than you do...be sure to do your research!

First awarded in 1982, the award is named for the author of *Island of the Blue Dolphins* and several other novels for children and teens.

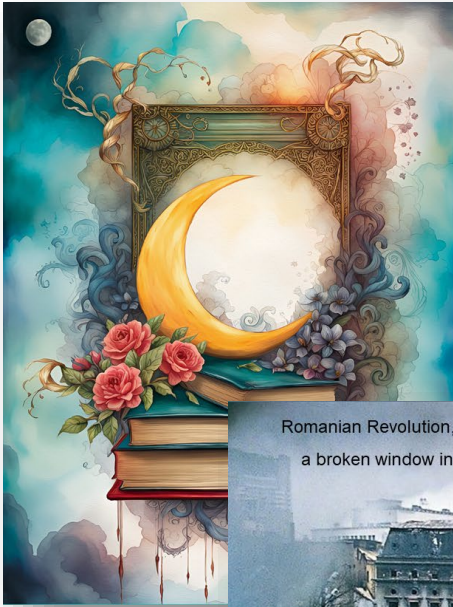

WORD OF THE WEEK

anachronism

(noun) An object from a future time period that appears in an historical setting

Anachronisms can be intentional or unintentional.

EXAMPLE:

In the movie *Titanic*, Jack tells Rose he once went ice-fishing on Lake Wissota. This lake did not exist in 1912, when the *Titanic* sank. Because it was not created until 1917, the mention of the lake is an anachronism in the movie.




