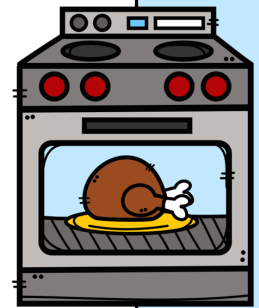


HAPPY THANKSGIVING!

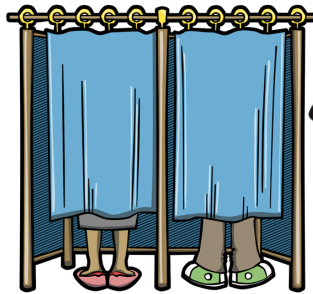

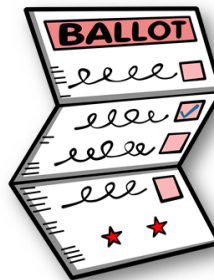
WHERE DO WE VOTE?

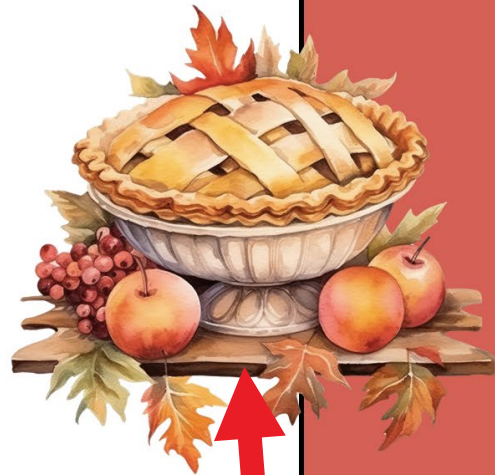

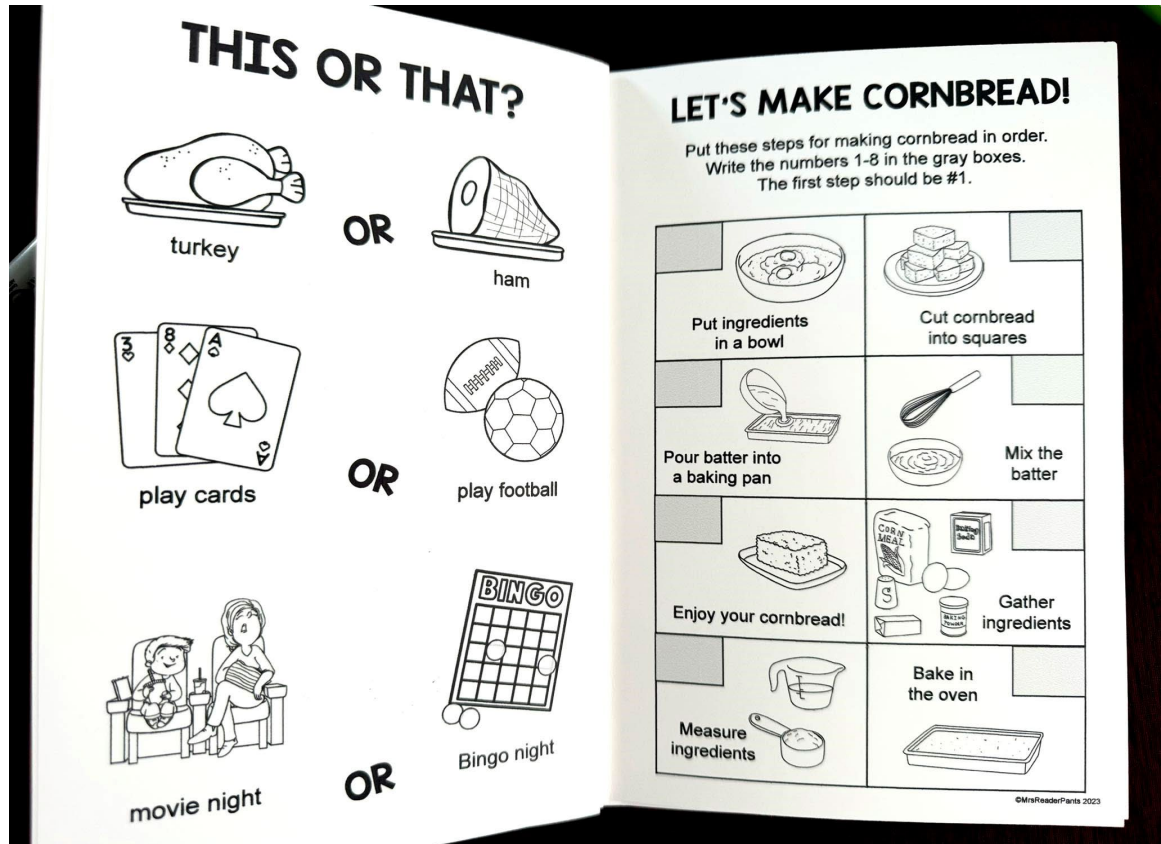
