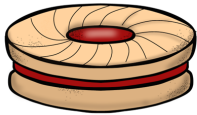

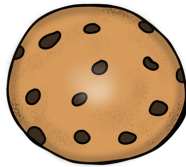

SURFING SANTAS!

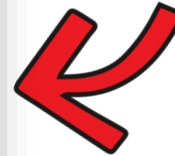
Christmas is not always during the winter.
