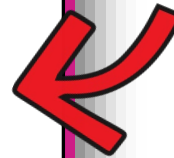

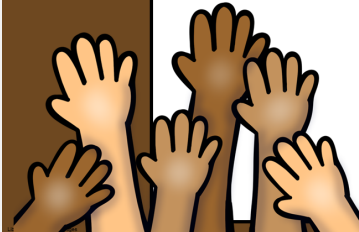

asked questions, and took notes.



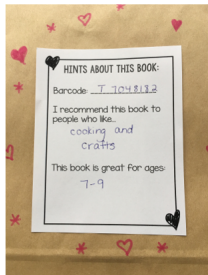

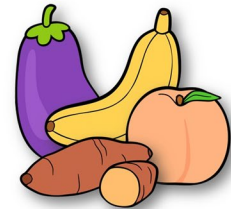


**BLACK HISTORY MONTH**
