


Pyongyang is the capital city of North Korea (note the empty streets) North Korea is very different from South Korea. The country is mostly cutoff from the rest of the world, even in times of great need and famine.

No peace treaty was ever signed after the Korean War ended in 1953. The two countries are technically still at war.

- The island is no longer used for these purposes, but there are still unexploded bombs.




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SCAVENGER HUNT




The elementary version includes a scavenger hunt activity to complete after the lesson.
