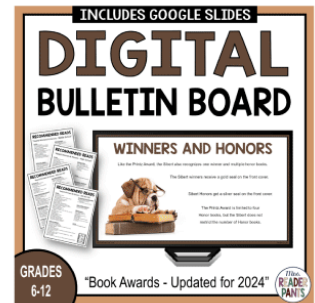
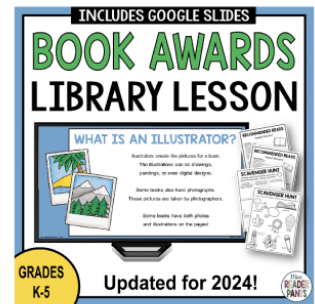

6-12 BOOKTALK AND/ OR SCROLLING SLIDES

SIBERT CRITERIA

To be eligible for the Sibert Award, books must be:

- informational
- published in the previous year
- written for children or teens
- first published in the USA



Additionally...

- Authors and illustrators must be citizens or residents of the USA
- Not eligible: fairy tales, folktales, and other traditional literature

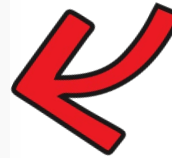

PRINTZ AWARD

The Printz Award is named for Michael L. Printz.

Mr. Printz was a high school librarian in Kansas. Like many librarians, he loved pairing students with the right books for them.

After his death in 1996, YALSA (Young Adult Library Services Association) honored Mr. Printz by naming the new award for YA literature after him.



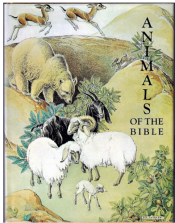

CALDECOTT AWARD



Animals of the Bible was the first Caldecott Award winner, in 1938.

If you like art, you'll love the **Caldecott Award!**

This is a very old award. The first Caldecott was given in 1938. The Caldecott is named for 19th Century British illustrator Randolph Caldecott.

The Caldecott is given for the artwork in a book.

THE ODYSSEY AWARD

Do you like to listen to books being read to you?

The **Odyssey Award** is given for outstanding audiobooks for kids and teens.

SECONDARY AWARDS INCLUDE:

CSK CRITERIA

To be eligible for the Coretta Scott King Award, books must:

- be published in the previous year
- be written for children or teens (ages 0-18)
- be of the highest literary quality
- be written and/or illustrated by an African American
- demonstrate an appreciation of African American culture and universal human values



PURA BELPRE CRITERIA

To be eligible for the Pura Belpré Award, books must be:

- written or illustrated by a Latinx author or illustrator
- a book that portrays, affirms, and celebrates the Latinx cultural experience
- Published in the USA or Puerto Rico
- published in the previous year
- written for children or teens (age 0-18)
- Fiction or nonfiction
- Published in Spanish, English, or bilingual



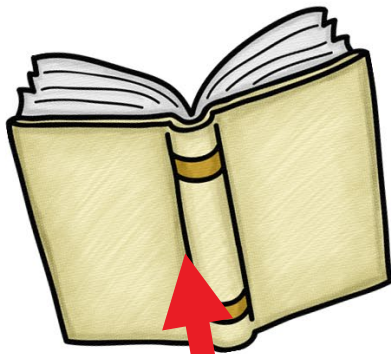
