To be eligible for the **Sibert Award**, books must be:


- informational
- · published in the previous year
- · written for children or teens
- first published in the USA

Additionally...

- · Authors and illustrators must be citizens or residents of the USA
- · Not eligible: fairy tales, folktales, and other traditional literature

Do you like to listen to books being read to you?


The <u>Odyssey Award</u> is given for outstanding audiobooks for kids and teens.

Published in the USA or Puerto Rico

published in the previous year

written for children or teens (age 0-18)

Fiction or nonfiction


Published in Spanish, English, or bilingual

The elementary version includes two differentiated scavenger hunt activities to complete after the lesson.


