

#### **STATE FLOWER**


The New York state flower is the rose.

Roses grow naturally in North America and in New York. They come in many colors, including red, pink, and white.

The rose is the national flower of the United States. It is also the state flower of Georgia, Iowa, and North Dakota.

#### **SNAPPING TURTLE**

The state reptile of New York is the snapping turtle.



- Snapping turtles are common across much of the eastern
  and central US and far southern Canada.
- Leave them alone! Their claws are as sharp as bear claws, and their bite can bite off human fingers and toes.
- Snapping turtles are <u>docile</u> (calm and peaceful) animals as long as you leave them alone.


### NIAGARA FALLS

- The mist from the falls creates rainbows!




