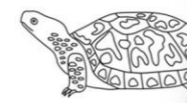

ROANOKE COLONY MYSTERY

In 1587, Englishman John White tried to establish the first permanent English colony in the New World. The colonists chose an island off the coast of North Carolina, called Roanoke Island.

When John White returned to Roanoke Island, he found only the word "Croatoan" carved into a tree.

John White left the island later in 1587 to get supplies. He was unable to return for a year because of bad weather in England and Spain.

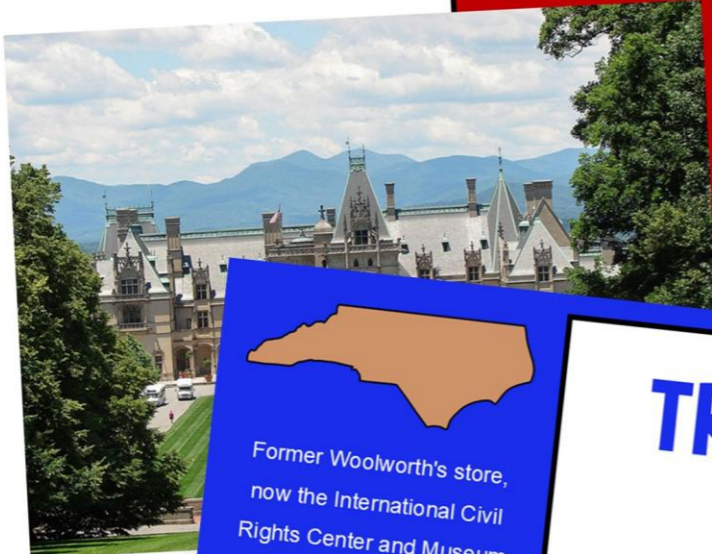
